Downey revives loan program for first-time homebuyers

■ CITY COUNCIL: Eligible borrowers could receive up to \$60,000 in loan assistance.

DOWNEY - The Downey City Council met Tuesday night and approved a variety of projects and

Below is a brief rundown of their actions:

 Council members voted to reinstate a first-time homebuyer program to assist low-to-moderate income residents interested in purchasing residential property in Downey.

partnership with the Neighborhood Housing Services (NHS), Downey agreed to commit \$353,000 in federal funds over a three-year period to provide deferred loans up to \$40,000 to qualified homebuyers. The NHS would match the loan for a total of \$60,000 in homebuyer assistance.

The loan carries a 3% interest rate over a 30-year term. Interest will be forgiven after the 20th year at a 1/10th rate per year; at the 30th year, the city's original loan amount and interest will be forgiven.

Downey residents will receive first priority for the loans, followed by people working in the city.

DOWNEY – Downey Police Department has joined several Los Angeles County law enforcement agencies in the #PinkPatchProject, an innovative campaign designed to raise public awareness of and raise

funds to combat breast cancer.

As a part of the campaign, officers from 25 different agencies throughout LA County will wear vibrant pink versions of their agency uniform patches during Breast Cancer Awareness Month in

The cost of higher education

I don't know about you, but my parents constantly remind me of how much easier I have it than they did at my age. I have more opportunities, more choices, and more crazy technology at my fingertips than they could have ever dreamed of. However, the one thing they say has definitely not gotten easier: education and employment.

According to my parents, a decent job could be found with just a high school education. If they sought higher education, a college degree was certainly a privilege, but still affordable. Not only that, but a college degree actually carried some weight when it came time to job search. It was an added bonus, like, "Wow! You have your bachelor's degree? That's great! You're so qualified! And hired!"

But now having a college degree is simply expected. Now it's more like this: "Wow. You have your bachelor's degree. That's great. You're just like 98% of our other job applicants. We'll call you." Ouch.

Having a bachelor's degree is no longer a qualification, it's an eligibility requirement that merely puts you in the "maybe" pile. I'm not quite sure when this happened, but at some point during my lifetime, a master's degree became the new bachelor's, and I have a sinking feeling that soon a PhD will be the new master's. The crippling debt and uncertainty about the future haunts me everyday, and I know that I am not alone in feeling this weight.

Student loan programs started off as a bridge to grant Americans access to education, which is a great sentiment in my book. However, these programs have grown into a money-making industry leaving American students in massive debt. According to ABC15's recent article on student debt, over 42 million people currently struggle with their student loans, constituting over \$1.3 trillion in total student debt. Those involved in student loan programs -- banks, private investors, the government, and Wall Street -- are getting richer off American students who are seeking out loans to cover the vast range of educational expenses. The student loan industry has a bright future with \$140 billion earned annually, unlike their customers who are struggling to pay the minimum monthly amount.

How is this fair? The banks and my own government are profiting off my hard work and my drive to achieve higher? You should be helping me! Applauding me! Or at the very least, not actively bankrupting me! And it makes me wonder, who of these profiteers even has a master's degree and a PhD? I truly believe that by the time I graduate, I will have paid more for my education and be more, or at least equally, qualified than the person I owe so much money to. Not only that, but it is the government's responsibility to address this issue and to find some kind of solution for the alarming amount of debt the average American student is accruing.

Good thing there's an upcoming presidential election. Surely these candidates understand the current job market's demand for a highly educated individual and will show some empathy for the tireless energy and money I'm investing in my future. Right? Right?!

On the Democratic front, Hillary Clinton has outlined a large-scale program for student debt relief, while the Republican Party has shown little initiative, not to mention empathy, for this growing issue. Although Republican candidate Donald Trump has acknowledged the rising costs of college tuition as problematic, voters hear mostly crickets when it comes to

So far he has taken no clear stance on the matter and has remained uncharacteristically quiet.

Trump's fellow Republicans haven't exactly followed suit. Ben Carson, having dropped out of the presidential race and declaring his endorsement for Trump, has taken a firm stance on students adhering to a strong work ethic, and of course, financial common sense. 



Paging Dr. Frischer...

Just last week, a teacher visited my in the fall. office with a pink and itchy eye. Pink eve, or conjunctivitis, was spreading through her elementary school classroom. This is one of the most common, contagious, and (thankfully) treatable eye conditions. There are roughly three million cases in the United States every year.

The "-itis" in conjunctivitis refers to inflammation, in this case of the conjunctiva, the thin, clear tissue that lines the inside of the eyelid. The inflammation makes the blood vessels of the eye more visible, giving the eye a pink appearance.

Pink eye is diagnosed with an eye exam, and your doctor may take a culture of the fluid in the eye if it is a severe case. There are three types of conjunctivitis:

Bacterial conjunctivitis results in a sticky, yellow or green eye discharge. Upon awakening, the eye may feel as if it is glued shut. Bacterial conjunctivitis is easily spread by direct contact by hands that have touched the eye. It's caused by bacteria, including staphylococcus aureus, streptococcus pneumonia, or haemophilus. It tends to occur in one eye, and may accompany an ear infection.

Bacterial conjunctivitis typically needs treatment. Mild bacterial conjunctivitis may get better without antibiotics, but antibiotic eye drops or ointment can help shorten its course, reduce its spread to others, and lessen the risk of complications.

Viral conjunctivitis causes itching in the eye, a watery discharge, and sensitivity to light. It is highly contagious and can be spread by coughing and sneezing. It is usually caused by the adenovirus, and might accompany an upper respiratory tract infection, cold, or sore throat.

Most pink eye cases caused by viruses are mild and will resolve by themselves in a week or two without treatment or lab tests. Antiviral medication may be prescribed for serious cases, including infections caused by herpes simplex, varicella zoster (chicken pox and shingles), or rubeola (measles).

Allergic conjunctivitis symptoms include watery, itchy eyes, a runny nose, sneezing, and scratchy throat. It affects both eyes and it is not contagious. It is caused by allergies to pollen, dust mites, molds, animal dander, irritants including contact lenses and solutions, chlorine from a swimming pool, smog, or makeup. It often occurs seasonally, during high

Most cases allergic conjunctivitis are mild and resolve on their own. Symptoms can be treated with artificial tears for the dryness, and cold packs



for the inflammation. Eye drops and oral medication for allergies may help. More importantly, reduce contact with the allergen (such as pollen, or animal

sensitivity to light, or blurring), if the eye is intensely red, if the pink eye gets worse, or if it simply doesn't go away.

How can we prevent conjunctivitis? As my teacher patient learned the hard way, viral and bacterial conjunctivitis are highly contagious and spread easily! Take these preventive steps:

- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water or an alcoholbased hand sanitizer, especially if you have touched an infected person's eyes, bedding, or clothing.
- Avoid touching or rubbing your
- If you have conjunctivitis, gently wash any discharge from the eye several times each day.
- If one eye is infected, don't use the same eye drop dispenser or bottle for the non-infected eye.
- Don't share makeup, makeup brushes, contact lenses or solutions, or eyeglasses with anyone who is infected. To avoid re-infecting yourself, throw away or sterilize any of these items you may have used while infected.

Our nation has made progress in road safety, reducing crash deaths by 31 percent from 2000 to 2013. But other high-income countries reduced crash deaths even further—by an average of 56 percent during the same period, according to the latest Vital Signs report by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Lower death rates in in the U.S., suggest that we can make more progress in saving lives. Compared with other high-income countries, the US had the:

- most motor vehicle crash deaths per 100,000 population and per 10,000 registered vehicles;
- second highest percentage of deaths involving alcohol (31 percent); and
- third lowest front seat belt use (87 percent).

If the U.S. had the same motor vehicle crash death rate as Belgium—the country with the second highest death rate after the U.S.—about 12,000 fewer lives would have been lost and an estimated \$140 million in direct medical costs would have been averted in 2013. And if the U.S. had the same rate as Swedenthe country with the lowest crash death rate-about 24,000 fewer lives would have been lost and an medical costs would have been averted in 2013.

For this Vital Signs report, CDC analyzed data compiled by the World Health Organization and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). CDC determined the

Bellflower grad wins gold medal at career tech contest

BELLFLOWER - Bellflower High School graduate Jacob Wright wrangled with the home network setup for hours, setting up a "cantenna" to capture an internet signal, linking the signal to a router and connecting a digital security camera, a glitchy tablet and television.

Then, he did what his competitors at the SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference did not – he re-checked every connection. In the process, he discovered a loose link -- he'd used the wrong tool to tighten co-axial cables.

Wright stepped back, took a breath, and relinked each of his cables securely with the right tool. His deliberate approach meant he finished after two other contestants at the competition – held June 20-24 in Louisville, Kentucky – but his dedication to quality made him first in the nation.

When his award was announced, Wright was taken by surprise.

"I was shocked. I was like, 'Are you sure it was me?' I just stood there for minutes, unbelieving. Then, I powerwalked to the stage and stood with the other winners as everyone cheered," Wright said. "It was an experience I'll never forget."

The trip was Wright's first visit to the national competition after Bellflower High teacher Julio Guzman sparked his interest in SkillsUSA, a contest and leadership program for students in career technical education fields.

As a junior, Wright had taken Guzman's electronics class and learned about SkillsUSA. In 2015, he competed regionally in a category for computer-based design. The competition for setting up residential networks is new this year, but 1948. was a natural fit for Wright.

"I've been naturally just interested in how things are connected to other things - how you can use your phone to access the thermostat or how you can use your phone to access a wireless camera to monitor your home. And I spend a lot of time helping friends fix their routers and home networks," Wright said.

Still, to make it to the national competition, he first had to shine at the Southern California regional competition and then had to win a gold medal at the state finals this spring. Each competition required a hands-on task, such as setting up a home theater system, along with a written test and an oral interview.




