City Council ponders action on no-fault evictions

Fearing evictions, renters are urging Downey council members to protect them ahead of a new housing law scheduled to take effect Jan. 1.

DOWNEY - With the fate of many of Downey's renters at stake, Downey City Council will meet next week to decide on if Downey will enact an emergency moratorium on no-fault evictions

With Assembly Bill 1482 looming just a few weeks away, Tuesday evening was council's chance to take its first steps in choosing if they want to intervene between the city's landlords and potentially evicted tenants.

AB 1482 – which was signed into law by Gov. Gavin Newsom in October and will take effect on Jan. 1 next year - imposes statewide rent control and prohibits no-fault evictions.

However, this has caused landlords in the region and statewide to try and beat the law's implementation by evicting their tenants without cause, allowing them to preemptively raise the rent.

It was Council Member Sean Ashton who asked for the issue to be brought to the Council on Tuesday.

"I wanted to have our attorney give us a briefing as to some of occurrence in past weeks, many the information that we've been of the group made use of the given as to regards to similar non-agenda and public agenda ordinances in other cities," said comment periods. Ashton.

"The heart and soul of these ordinances typically are listing of what the landlord can do with respect to eviction," said Garcia. "It essentially prohibits the landlord from evicting tenants for no cause, for no reason. These ordinances lay out the criteria for which a landlord may evict a tenant, and some of those elements mirror the new law, AB 1482."

appropriate eviction could include default in payment of rent, nuisance, criminal or unlawful activity, breach of rental agreement or lease, amongst others.

Ashton's request had already drawn the ire of Greater Downey Association of Realtors (DAOR), who threatened a lawsuit against the city should the council make any moves on the topic.

In a letter to Mayor Rick Rodriguez, DAOR President Dan Nevarez said the Realtor's Association opposes AB 1482, and that any moratoriums put in place before it's official roll out would "force [the DAOR] to take legal action and seek an injunction."

For Downey to pass any such ordinance, it will require four out of five council members to vote for its approval. Frometa went on to say that she and her council colleagues would continue to have the conversation about a potential moratorium, however firmly put her foot down against what she described as "the mob



I have been paying attention to your plight; just because I don't show up to a vigil one night doesn't mean I don't care...I am not going to be bullied or threatened by any type of charade you bring."

"Let me be very clear, this mob mentality cannot continue... We will do whatever we can to help you, because you are one of us, and we are one of you. It is not us against you, and you against us. That is not how it works."

Ashton, was also visibly emotional, addressed the crowd, saying, "your issues are my

"You're affecting a lot of families over something that can be worked out," said Ashton, in regards to landlords. "This is really something that could've been taken care of in a way, but we're forced to have to deal with this now...we're left in this loophole area where nothing is being done, but we're giving some landlords the opportunity to be greedy and take advantage of the situation. That's what truly bothers me."

"Some people in the audience

"I have been listening to you, mentioned, 'You don't have to do anything.' Technically, you're right; we don't. But I know I could not sleep at night if I had that attitude. This is affecting families, kids, senior citizens. This is affecting multiple people."

There were several options that Council could follow, including the aforementioned moratorium, continuing the discussion on to a later date, implementation of AB 1482 early in Downey, down to nothing at

While those in the audience seemed to support an early implementation, ultimately all three remaining council members agreed to have staff bring a nofault eviction ordinance back to council next week.

Meanwhile, Mayor Pro Tem Blanca Pacheco encouraged those in attendance to seek legal counsel and other resources, should they find themselves facing an unlawful detainer.

The council will now meet next Wednesday, Nov. 20, to make their final decision.

City rejects Wilderness Park bids

DOWNEY - Downey's City Council rejected all bids for the Wilderness Park ponds restoration project on Tuesday, instead opting to split the work amongst several "prime" contractors.

Five bids were received for the pond restoration contract. However, staff decided that a "multi-prime" procurement would prove to be more effective and economically efficient.

Instead of being handled by one entity, the pond project will now be divvied up between several specific trade contractors - such as mechanical, electrical, landscaping, and concrete - on a low bid basis.

Staff also intends to procure a prefabricated pedestrian bridge

system through a sole-source informal bid process. Restoration of the ponds is already in progress, with the first

phase – water and sludge removal completed. Alex Dominguez, staff writer



Warren High students build bunk beds for wildfire victims

DOWNEY - At the beginning of October, students from Warren High School's SkillsUSA program participated in the Lowe's Generation T Bunk Bed Build at Rose Bowl Stadium to build 100 bunk beds, most of which will be donated to victims of last year's Camp Fire in Northern California.

Alongside 300 other SkillsUSA students, these 22 Construction Technology students from Warren spent the day constructing and building bunk beds to help children in need and raise awareness of the skilled trades gap that is currently impacting California.

While the skilled trades shortage affects the entire country, its impacts are great in California. The construction industry in California has lost nearly 20 percent of its workforce over the past 11 years, according to a study released by Buildzoom.

To help close the skilled trades gap and in partnership with more than 60 national organizations, Lowe's launched Generation

T, a movement that offers skilled trades career and training opportunities for students. The Generation T program also includes immersion events such as this one that allows students to gain additional exposure to skilled trades through hands-on

Warren High School's SkillsUSA Construction Technology students participated in this event to give back to the community and connect with the various industry partners that took part in the Bunk Build which included Lowe's, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, Timberland, Samsung, People Ready and Tuft & Needle.

The high school students who participated in this event are on a carpentry track, meaning that they are completing carpentry career and technical education (CTE) courses, in addition to completing the SkillsUSA framework components. Once these students complete their CTE courses, they will receive industry certification.

According to an event release, "carpentry careers are expected to grow by at least eight percent in a 10-year time frame, with trade school and apprenticeship graduates boasting a high degree of employability." This fact alone thrusts these 22 Warren SkillsUSA Construction Technology students towards a successful future post-graduation.

The bunk beds were donated to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, a nonprofit that works to address child bedlessness. Some bunk beds were distributed to Pasadena families immediately following the event; others were loaded on trucks and transported 10 hours north, designated for families impacted by the Camp wildfire last


Tuft & Needle and Serta donated the mattresses and bedding to accompany the 100 bunk beds.



I'm a police chief. We need to change how officers view their guns.

Few things are more harrowing than watching a video of a police officer confront a person in emotional crisis armed with a knife or other similar object. The officer almost always points a gun at that person and yells, "Drop it!" If staring down the barrel of a gun isn't enough to give a person pause, yelling at him or her is unlikely to make a difference.

If that person advances on the police officer, gunfire often results. Each year, American police officers shoot and kill well over 125 people armed with knives, many of them in this manner.

The public has grown impatient with seeing the same approach produce a predictably tragic result. In response, Chuck Wexler, the director of the Police Executive Research Forum, has released a guide to reducing the frequency of such incidents. At a national conference for chiefs of police in Chicago recently, he showed three videos to drive the point home: desperate people with knives met by officers who pointed guns and yelled in return.

In each case, the person grew more distressed, advanced out of a desire to be shot and was shot. Everyone suffers when this happens: the person in crisis who gets shot and may well die; the officer who will experience lifelong trauma and doubt, and his or her family and loved ones; and a community that feels it failed to help a person in

One of the problems is that we teach our police officers to lead with the gun. We tell officers that a knife or a shard of glass is always a lethal threat and that they should aggressively meet it with a lethal

threat in return. But doing so forecloses all of the better ways to communicate with a person in crisis. There are alternatives.

Imagine being an unarmed police officer — like the ones in Iceland or Britain — in the same scenario. Barking orders as you stand there empty-handed would not only seem unnatural but also absurd. Your instincts would tell you to stay a safe distance away, try to contain the person, and calm the situation.

American police leaders can learn from their unarmed colleagues. Police academies should ingrain a wide range of skills, drills and responses in trainees before they ever handle a firearm. Training should start by sending officers into scenarios where they have to solve problems without recourse to lethal force.

Unarmed officers will cultivate an instinct to de-escalate: They will keep a safe distance, they will try to assess the true level of threat rather than see a weapon as a cue to rapidly escalate, and they will communicate in ways that reach people. There is good psychological research on what type of communication stands the best chance of calming people in distress, regardless of what is in their hands. And is certainly not yelling at them or threatening their lives

Only during the final phase of a police academy should trainees be presented with a firearm and taught how to use it. Officers should be taught that their weapons protect not only themselves and the public but also the life of the person who is armed and in distress, because they provide a means to stay safe if a calm and reassuring approach fails. By the end of academy, the officers will have learned that yelling at a person as you threaten to shoot is a panicked, lastditch effort, not a sign of competence.

I lead the police force in Burlington, Vt., one of the nation's most progressive cities. One of our City Council members recently suggested that we should explore ways to disarm our city's police because it would prevent them from killing people and force them to approach crises differently.

In America, this idea is a non-starter. Police officers being rendered helpless to respond to mass shootings and other gun violence puts a community in danger. But if the police profession doesn't want politicians broaching these ideas, we owe the public a commitment to doing everything we can to respect the sanctity of life. We should fundamentally change the way police officers view

America's abhorrent rate of gun violence means that the police need the equipment and training to meet even the most lethal threats. But we have the opportunity to stop this mind-set from infecting their approach other situations. Our nation's police departments should read Mr. Wexler's guide and take its recommendations

Going further by training officers to act as if their weapons are insurance policies, rather than persuasive devices, will transform the nation's police work. Every American will be made safer by police officers whose first instinct is to communicate with the people they encounter and whose success lies in getting the psychology of persuasion right.

Why it is so hard to figure out what to eat

Most diet trials in the best journals fail even the most basic of quality control measures. That's the finding of a study by us published today on JAMA Network Open.

Investigators receiving funding for any clinical trial from the National Institutes of Health must register in advance what they plan to test, among other design features, to ensure that the data are fairly analyzed. Comparing the original registries with the final published studies, we found that diet trials in the past decade were about four times as likely as drug trials to have a discrepancy in the main outcome or measurement — raising concern for bias.

This quality-control problem of diet trials in comparison to ones on pharmaceuticals leads to a bigger issue: underinvestment in nutrition research and in how we tackle the mysteries of a healthy

Although the problems with observational studies have received much attention ("Association doesn't prove causation," as scientists say), clinical trials can suffer from equally important limitations. In a clinical trial, investigators assign volunteers to receive different treatments — such as a low-carbohydrate versus low-fat diet ideally in random order. Beyond registry issues, trials may provide misleading results for many reasons, including small size, short duration and weak interventions (they lack power to actually make the intended change in behavior).

These failures are disturbing because epidemics of diet-related disease will shorten life expectancy and impose huge economic costs on the United States in coming years. We continue to lack effective dietary prevention, in part because clinical trials have been too poorly designed and conducted to reach definitive conclusions. We're still debating questions that have raged for decades: Should we focus on reducing carbs or fat? Is red meat harmful? Is sugar toxic? What about artificially sweetened beverages or moderate amounts of alcohol?

High-quality trials are hard to do because diets, and the behavior of humans who consume them, are so complicated. A single meal might have dozens of nutrients and hundreds of other bioactive substances that interact in unknown ways. Furthermore, if the diet being studied increases intake from one food category, people may eat less from other food categories, making it difficult to attribute

results to any specific dietary component.

Diet trials also require subjects to change their eating habits, a far greater challenge than taking a pill.

Consider a trial for a promising cancer treatment in which participants assigned to receive the drug didn't take it as intended. If the drug group showed no benefit over the placebo group, we wouldn't automatically assume the drug lacked promise. We would conclude that the study failed and that stronger methods (medication organizer trays and daily text message reminders, say) are needed to make sure the drug is properly used so that we can see if it works. Yet the illogical assumption that a diet didn't work is commonly made when volunteers in weak trials do not follow the assigned diets.

Short diet trials, the great majority of those done, raise special concerns. Many people can lose weight by restricting calories at first, but few can maintain substantial weight loss that way. After a few days or weeks, the body begins to resist calorie deprivation, with rising hunger and slowing metabolism. Making matters more complicated, it takes several weeks to adapt to major changes in nutrients. For these reasons, short-term trials may have little relevance to understanding how diet affects health over the long

It would be like studying an intensive exercise program including long runs, calisthenics and strenuous sports — among sedentary volunteers for just six days. The investigators might find that the program made the volunteers sore, tired and weak. However, a six-month trial, allowing adequate time to adapt to the new regimen, would reach the opposite conclusion, revealing the real benefits of physical activity.

Despite their greater difficulties, diet trials receive far less funding than drug trials, especially considering that poor diet is the leading risk factor for premature death. Few big companies stand to profit directly from dietary treatments for chronic diseases. Consequently, typical diet trials must get by on shoestring budgets, rarely exceeding a few hundred thousand dollars, compared with drug trials that may cost several hundred million dollars. Without adequate support, quality inevitably suffers. Diet trials of adequate size, duration and intervention strength rarely get done.

This problem has special relevance now, as the Dietary Guidelines

Advisory Committee reviews the science in preparation for new Department of Agriculture recommendations to the public in 2020. Among thousands of scientific articles initially screened, only a small proportion so far have passed strict quality criteria for inclusion in committee deliberations. And ultimately, recommendations to the public can be no stronger than the science on which they rely.

Which doesn't mean that all nutrition research is unreliable. High-quality observational studies and clinical trials provide strong evidence for the benefits of whole carbohydrates (nonstarchy vegetables, fruits, legumes, minimally processed intact grains) over highly processed, fast-digesting carbohydrates (refined grains, potato products and added sugar). We also know that nuts, olive oil and avocado protect against chronic disease, contrary to dietary recommendations during the low-fat diet era, as embodied by the 1992 Food Guide Pyramid.

We need a sort of Manhattan Project to find definitive answers to the epidemics of diet-related disease. Nutrition research to prevent disease must have the same quality and rigor as pharmaceutical research to treat disease. Building the necessary scientific infrastructure will require sustained investment by government and philanthropic organizations, but the amounts involved would total a fraction of a cent for every dollar spent treating diet-related conditions like obesity, Type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

Study authors and the media can help by avoiding the tendency to overstate the results of weak research, contributing to public confusion. And the public has a critical role to play, not only demanding government action but also volunteering for diet studies.

No other factor approaches the importance of diet for public health. To reduce the human toll of chronic disease, we must upgrade the quality of nutrition research. The financial investment required will yield huge returns in medical cost savings.

Do we really need billionaires?

Bill Gates wants you to know he pays taxes.

"I've paid more than \$10 billion in taxes. I've paid more than anyone in taxes," Gates told journalist Andrew Ross Sorkin. "But when you say I should pay \$100 billion, OK, then I'm starting to do a little math about what I have left over.

Supposedly Gates was talking about a wealth tax 2020 candidates have supported. But no plan yet proposed would seize \$100 billion from the philanthrocapitalist anytime soon. Even if it did, he'd still

be one of the richest men in the world, with \$7 billion left over.

Gates isn't the only billionaire who's worried. JPMorgan Chase CEO Jamie Dimon also has concerns about the rising resentment towards his fellow elites.

"I think you should vilify Nazis," Dimon told Lesley Stahl, "but you shouldn't vilify people who worked hard to accomplish things." Billionaire investor Leon Cooperman, who's become a fixture on CNBC, recently teared up while complaining about the "vilification of billionaires.

billionaire class suck up so much media attention?

For one thing, billionaires literally own the news. Buying up media companies is a new rite of passage for the ultra wealthy, like the purchase of the Washington Post by Amazon head Jeff Bezos, or TIME by tech CEO Marc Benioff.

They'll say they're all about editorial independence, but the truth is billionaire ownership can affect news output. When billionaire Joe Ricketts found out the staff of DNAinfo, a network of city-based

news sites he owned, was unionizing, he promptly shut down the entire venture out of spite.

There are more subtle ways in which the rich buy media access. The Gates Foundation, for example, has poured millions in donations into the media over the last several years to raise awareness around the foundation's philanthropic goals — including its controversial funding of charter schools.

Not all billionaire power is publicly broadcast, however.

In their book Billionaires and Stealth Politics, researchers Why do the feelings of the 600 Americans that constitute our Benjamin Page, Jason Seawright, and Matthew J. Lacombe document how economic elites have banded together to lobby for extremely conservative policies, like cutting estate taxes, opposing regulations on the environment and Wall Street, and gutting social programs.

> Because these moves are highly unpopular, they've done this work in the background.

> That means there's a network of billionaires aligned with the Koch brothers, who've poured hundreds of millions of dollars into anti-labor policies. And Rupert Murdoch, the media mogul who changed the media landscape with Fox News. And casino magnate Sheldon Adelson, who's spending his billions shaping U.S. foreign


> Their enormous wealth offers them an outlandishly oversized role in our democracy. It's poisoning both our politics and our media.

> So how about a ban on billionaires? Let's tax away their wealth, but let's get them off our airwaves, too. Imagine what we'd learn if corporate media didn't devote entire news cycles to the whims of the



Closing Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall will have major implications

This article will focus on the new changes in the Juvenile Court System, how it will affect the public, and what is in store for the future. Should we be moving away from a system where public safety is paramount and now shall be inferior to offender rehabilitation?

I believe this move will result in criminal and self-destructive behavior in minors, and lead to a greater increase in serious juvenile crime and drug addiction.

The system, before these recent changes, required the juvenile court to protect the public from juvenile crime. Within the cloak of that protection was the mandate to do all that was possible to rehabilitate the minor. The court tried to create a reasonable balance between public safety and rehabilitation.

The system handled first offenders and minor crimes with diversion programs consistent with an assessment of the minor. Many times a minor would be ordered to do 3 to 6 months of supervised probation, and if good behavior resulted, the case would be dismissed and the minor's record would be expunged.

15 to 30 page report describing the minor's family condition, school performance, prior record, and gang or drug involvement. The report would recommend treatment program that included a range of services: drug counseling, therapy for sexual abuse, gangs, violent behavior, psychiatric help, and family therapy. A team of therapists could be assigned to work with the family to improve communication and condition of the family environment.

The court would review each case every 60 days. If the behavior was unsatisfactory, the degree of treatment could be increased. If the home was unsafe or ineffective, the minor could be placed in an agency home. If the conduct was dangerous to the public or the minor, a camp placement of six to nine months could be ordered. Most therapy would be done by outside agencies who employ experts.

LA County is the mother of the modern teen-age gang. The Crips, Bloods, and MS 13, were founded here and spread across the U.S. and Central America. We have 800 identified fighting gangs and 150,000 gang affiliated youth. The court dealt with 20,000 arrests a year. These gangs are provided drugs for sale

adult prison gang.

The first change in the Juvenile Court occurred four years ago when the Juvenile System eliminated the District Attorney from filing cases and gave the process to Probation. Court filings were cut by some 50%, not because of a decrease in crime, but on the theory that the principal purpose of the Juvenile System should be focused primarily on the offender, rather than consideration of public

The unforeseen consequence was that there was no enforcement of informal probation orders. Thus, there were no consequences for noncompliance and additional bad behavior. This leads to worsening of the minor's behavior, be it crime or drugs. Also lost, was the therapeutic effect of going to court and having the minor's parents focus on his or her behavior and facing a judge.

Another unforeseen consequence of reduced court filings was the illusion that juvenile crime had been reduced. This resulted in the reduction of juvenile halls from three to two. The Los Padrinos Hall in Downey was closed in July, 2019, and all custody matters for all of Los

It involvement, and other felonies Fernando Valley are now placed in East Los Angeles. Arrested minors who are not picked up by their parents within five hours at a local police station are now required by law to be sent to Eastlake Hall in East Los Angeles.

> Still another consequence was the reduction in the number awareness, critical thinking, and of Court Houses dedicated to juvenile matters. When The Los Padrinos Court House in Downey was closed, in 2019, hereafter, all cases from the Southeast cities were to be held in Compton. The Los Padrinos Court House was solely dedicated as a juvenile facility. The entire staff, including sheriffs, attorneys, and probation was completely dedicated to juvenile crime.

The Compton Court is an adult criminal facility of several floors, and only three court rooms are used for juvenile. The entire focus is on adult crime.

The next major change came on murder and attempted murder cases in which the District Attorney determined the minor to be unfit for juvenile rehabilitation. The Legislature now requires the DA to make written findings on some 50 factors regarding a case. This requires several experts to testify with hearings lasting from six months to a year. If the judge keeps the minor in juvenile court on a murder case, the rehabilitation time is limited to two years by the division of Juvenile Justice and the minor is then released home.

The third major change occurred in August 2019, by vote of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, to create a Youth Development Agency to handle the 20,000 juvenile arrests each

The concept of a Youth Development Agency requires the rejection of all present County Agencies: Courts, Probation, presentation.

will create a new agency that from Youth Development and will add to an already bloated bureaucracy.

Within this new agency there appears to be no provision for Juvenile Hall for 24 hour stays for law enforcement whatsoever. All resources will be dedicated to mental health, cultural empathy for others.

This is laudable, but with no law enforcement component to back it up, it amounts to voluntary rehabilitation. There is little concern for the safety of the minor if he or she rejects

The true and lasting result will be that adult gang members will use minor gang members to carry out serious crimes because they are aware that there will be little consequence to the minor.

The Board of Supervisors must be contacted by concerned citizens while the Youth Development Agency is being finalized

I submit the following modest recommendations at this time:

1. Sever definitively all crimes of violence, serious drug return them to the District Attorney and the Court.

2. Re-open Los Padrinos parent pick-up.

3. Re-open the Los Padrinos Court, as this court was dedicated to juvenile cases, unlike other courts which handle adult crime and civil matters.

4. Season ...

invenile "crime" with personnel.

5. Restore the District Attorney and Court System for most cases. The recidivism rate for juvenile courts was a fraction of that for adults.*

*The recidivism rate of adults returning to crime is a steady 70%. The recidivism rate at Los Padrinos Court before the filing change was 25% based of earlier statistics and recent estimates.

Judge Mautino was the Supervising Judge of the Los Padrinos Juvenile Court, Downey, for 17 years, handling all cases within the cities of southeast Los Angeles County.





Throughout this whole time, my mother kept repeating, "Mijo, mira" (son, look). I turned around to see what she was pointing at. Oh, believe me, I wanted to say something to scold her for scaring me but I couldn't. The only words that came out of my mouth were, "Si, mama, it's a beautiful sunset."

She turned around and gave me the biggest and most calming smile I ever saw. At that moment, I was looking at something magical in front of





Verizon to install equipment on **Edison towers**

DOWNEY - Verizon Wireless have will be installing and operating a wireless communication facility at the existing tower located on Imperial Highway.

> Verizon will now be installing nine six-foot tall panel antennas, six 28-inch tall wireless remote radios, and three 28.9-inch tall junction boxes on the 111-foot tall California Edison transmission tower, 45 feet above the ground.

24-inch diameter microwave antenna dish will also be installed 26-feet above the ground, along with three equipment cabinets below the tower, and placement of a pedestal, transformer, and pull boxes near the northeast corner of the parcel.

Located on the southside of Imperial Highway, the site sits north of the I-105 Freeway between Woodruff Avenue and the San Gabriel River.

The project is similar to other wireless communication facilities that have been approved on other Edison towers, including two within the same area.


